

Main news since last October is the expansion of WASP into the field of AI with an additional 1 billion Swedish kronor granted by the Knut and Alice Wallenberg foundation. The initiative will follow two main pathways: one will venture into machine learning and next generation AI. The second path will work on the mathematical principles underlying AI, to truly understand them and to progress AI further. With this additional funding WASP will frontline the research and development of AI in Sweden. The grant will also enable development of new graduate schools, recruitment of senior researchers, and the building of a computer and calculation infrastructure that will benefit the whole field of AI in Sweden.

Other developments within the program are that WASP has opened the door to the security area, where a cluster for security research has been formed. The software area has been further strengthened, and the work ahead in spring is to formulate how the AI-expansion will influence the research areas of WASP.
